






Critical care is one of the best places to learn and understand drug behaviour due to its **dynamic environment** and **to build clinical experience**.

Leading Change in a Multidisciplinary Team

We had a patient who experienced complications with Heparin and scheduled for cardiac surgery. Given the challenging case, I initiated a discussion among the **multidisciplinary healthcare team** on the perioperative and intra-operative drug of choice and dosing strategies for the patient. I also attended the operative procedure to adjust the non-Heparin parenteral anticoagulant dosing based on the patient's specific clinical condition. The surgery was successful. I was pleased to apply my **expertise in critical care and broad-based clinical skills to optimise therapeutic care** through **interprofessional collaboration**.


Meet Our Geriatric Specialist Pharmacist!

Applying Theory to Practice



We received feedback from nursing homes about a medication with friable tablets. When dosed twice a day (as a quarter tablet), the packing center couldn't cut them and instructed the nursing homes to do it themselves. Leveraging my advanced pharmacokinetics expertise from my residency and specialist training, I resolved this by suggesting a switch to once-daily dosing (half a tablet). I also **shared this insight** with colleagues encountering similar challenges.







In 2018, I established the **long-term follow-up clinic** for stem cell transplant patients at SGH and completed the National Collaborative Prescribing Practitioner course, enabling me to run the clinic **independently** as a collaborative prescriber. It was **deeply rewarding** to be part of a **multidisciplinary team**, witnessing patients return for their yearly visits, some of whom underwent transplants as long as 30 years ago, and seeing their **continued survival and health**.

Research-Driven Intervention

I recall a patient who developed significant weakness due to a bacterial infection and became very ill. Unfortunately, first-line treatment wasn't immediately available. Through a thorough review and analysis of the literature, I was able to provide valuable input to the medical team using my special expertise as a paediatric infectious disease pharmacist, helping them deliberate on a suitable alternative treatment. I designed an infusion protocol that successfully treated the child, leading to their improvement.

Compassion and Empathy

Show genuine concern for the well-being of patients and family, as well as be sensitive to their needs.



Excellent analytical and clinical reasoning skills

 Interpret literature well and apply it to individual patients accordingly

What are the perks of being a pharmacy specialist?

We can advocate for policies, practices, and research to have better and safer medication prescribing for children

With our knowledge and experience, we can help caregivers and parents understand and safely manage their children's medications more effectively

What excites you to be a specialist pharmacist in Paediatrics?

Paediatric Pharmacy is a very specialised and complex area of medicine, requiring expertise in drug usage across ages from **neonates** to adolescents

Unique challenges include **drug dosing** and **formulation** for children as most drug trials are conducted in adults

Research work in antimicrobial stewardship to evaluate if applied strategies are effective in improving antimicrobial use in hospitals



Drive Up-To-Date **Evidence-Based Care**

Develop and update guidelines based on latest evidence for neonates and paediatrics



Develop Targeted & Personalised Care Plans

Conduct extensive literature reviews to support individualised treatment strategies and to select suitable dosage forms to ensure correct dosing in children
