

Case Study:

Overservicing (Otorhinolaryngology)

Case Details

- A 30+ year-old patient previously diagnosed with obstructive sleep apnoea (OSA) was referred to an ENT surgeon for worsening snoring over the last 6 months, accompanied by fatigue and daytime drowsiness.
- Patient had never had a trial of continuous positive airway pressure (CPAP) therapy, but had undergone bilateral inferior turbinoplasty, bilateral tonsillectomy, partial uvulectomy, and palate radiofrequency surgery.
- Surgeon admitted the patient for day surgery, and 5 TOSP codes were submitted (SM714N, SM701T, SM724N, SM700N and SM711S)

Claim Adjudication

- Case notes and supporting documents were requested from the doctor and medical institution.
- An independent Specialist Panel appointed by the MediShield Life Council reviewed the treatment and claim.

Panel Findings and Decision

The Panel found the following claim components were deemed to be **inappropriate**:

- <u>SM701T</u>: There was no evidence or documentation to show that the patient had been counselled and offered a trial of more appropriate conservative therapy such as CPAP or oral appliances.
- 2. <u>SM724N</u>: The photo-documentation provided did not show a clinically significant deviation of the nasal septum causing obstruction.
- <u>SM700A</u>: The photo-documentation provided did not show clinically significant adenoid hypertrophy.
- 4. <u>SM711S</u>: The procedure should not have been offered before a trial of conservative treatment, and pre-operative imaging done to confirm which sinuses were involved.

Key Learning Points

- Conditions that should initially be treated conservatively should generally receive such treatment before surgery is offered, unless there are medical indications for surgery to be done first.
- Written and photo documentation may be required as evidence for the Panel's deliberation on the appropriateness of the treatment and MSHL claim.

- The total charges from inappropriate items or codes amounted to approximately \$25,000.
- Enforcement action will be taken against the doctor who certified the inappropriate claim.
 Egregious or repeated non-compliances will lead to suspension or revocation of the doctor's MediSave and MediShield Life (2M) accreditation.
