

Case Study:

# Inappropriate Multi-coding (Urology)



#### **Case Details**

- A 50+ year old patient with asymptomatic microscopic haematuria found on screening presented to surgeon for further investigation.
- CT urogram revealed multiple bilateral stones. A first attempt at endoscopic treatment was unsuccessful due to severe spasm. Indwelling ureter stents were left in place to expedite dilation.
- Two weeks later surgeon performed RIRS and stone extraction for both kidneys, and submitted a MediShield Life claim with 6 TOSP codes for this surgical episode.

### Claim Adjudication

- Case notes and supporting documents were requested from the doctor and medical institution.
- An independent Specialist Panel appointed by the MediShield Life Council reviewed the treatment and claim.

### Panel Findings and Decision

The Panel found that components of the provided treatment claimed were deemed to be inappropriate.

- 2 x SG709B: These should not have been coded separately as they were already part of the main procedure (SG727K).
- <u>SG711B:</u> This should not have been coded separately as it was already part of the main procedure (SG727K).

## **Key Learning Points**

- Doctors should not claim multiple codes for individual surgical steps which are already part of a surgery described by a single TOSP code.
- Additional documentation may be required as evidence for the Panel's deliberation on the appropriateness of the treatment and MediShield Life claim.

- The total charges from inappropriate items or codes amounted to approximately \$8,100.
- Enforcement action will be taken against the doctor who certified the inappropriate claim. Egregious or repeated non-compliances will lead to suspension or revocation of the doctor's MediSave and MediShield Life accreditation.
