

## Case Study:

# **OVERSERVICING**

## **CASE DETAILS**

- Patient presented with abdominal pain and a suprapubic mass on physical exam.
- Ultrasound of the pelvis suggested the presence of uterine fibroids and an endometrial polyp, as well as normal ovulation follicles in the ovaries.
- Doctor performed the following procedures:
- 1 | Open myomectomy (SI815U)
- 2 Cystectomy (SI803O)
- <sup>3</sup> Dilation & Curettage (D&C) (SI843U)
- Transcervical resection of polyp (TCR)<2cm (SI704C)

#### PANEL DECISION

The Panel assessed that:

Cystectomy was not warranted as pre-operative ultrasound of the ovaries showed normal ovulation follicles (cyst-like), which were not indicated for removal. Histology later confirmed that the removed lesion was a physiological cyst.

Total charges from inappropriate items/codes: ~\$9,900

### **KEY LEARNING POINTS**

Conditions that can be treated with observation or conservative treatment should not be surgically managed.
